

Upgrade woes...

Thinking of upgrading your operating system? Well hang on! It's usually a necessity but carries a host of wrinkles that you'll have to contend with. But once you get through it all, it will be like having your best friend home for the holidays.

This is just some of the encounters I've had as I upgraded my Power Mac G3 operating system from 8.1 to 9.2

I installed ram to take it from 64 MB to 768 MB. I actually did it all by myself and was quite impressed until the entire computer froze up. Granted, I hadn't done any upgrading since purchasing the computer in June of 1998, but the "simple upgrade" hasn't been real simple for me and I've invested a lot of time in it. In hindsight I shouldn't have got so far behind today's technology.

I do feel grateful for all the programs that do work. But that's why I've decided to make a commitment to **LAMUG**. I just can't make it out there in the ever changing computer world all by myself. There's just too much information and too little time.

But the 768 MB of Ram has added an incredible amount of ease to my life. The newer Photoshop has some incredible features as well as the newer versions of Excel and Word. I've got a fairly new browser and email program and my computer is starting to feel like my best friend again.

I can now put hundreds more fonts in the hard drive without any complications and that Sherlock finder program is superb!

My only suggestion is this - If you're not comfortable upgrading by yourself then don't. Either call a friend who knows more than you do, find someone through **LAMUG** or go to a professional.



LAMUG is Looking for Volunteers

As a volunteer, what tasks will you be asked to complete? Well, it all depends on YOU. If you,d like to sit on the Board of Directors, your term would run for one year. At the end of your term, you could run for the same office, run for a different position, or sit back and let someone else have a chance to offer their skills.

What do we ask of our volunteers? Before anyone offers their skills for a Board position, they should know what their duties include. At LAMUG, these are the duties of our individual Board members:

- 1) **President** presides over Executive Board meetings
- 2) **Vice President** arranges presenters for the general meetings
- 3) Technical Advisor a school employee, takes care of technical issues, and is usually a position given to the person responsible for the equipment at our meetings
- 4) **Treasurer** keeps the board informed of income and expenses on a regular basis
- 5) **Membership Director** keeps membership list and mailing list
- 6) CiderPress Newsletter Editor creates monthly

newsletter

- 7) **Webmaster** maintains LAMUG website, checks its content and links
- 8) **AppleWorks SIG** coordinates AppleWorks activities
- 9) **Software Liaison/Vendor Relations** arranges special User Group deals and coordinates reviewers with products
- 10) Community Outreach Director finds ways for the group to do good works which benefit the community and other non-profits
- 11) **School Liaison Director** contacts all local schools and colleges to find out how we might help with their projects and vice versa
- 12) **Secretary** keeps a record of the board's decisions and actions
- 13) **Public Relations** publicizes group activities
- 14) **Club Photographer** takes pictures of club activities for the newsletter and for press releases
- 15) Fundraising Director

The Board of Directors officers must be members of the group and attend two meetings a month, which include the general monthly meeting and the executive board meeting. The meetings typically run for two hours, with the general meeting sometimes lasting three hours, depending on the presentation that evening. Terms are limited to two years.
